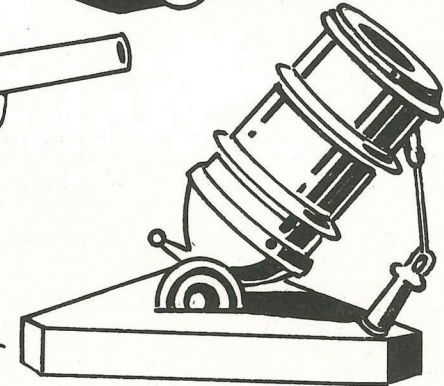
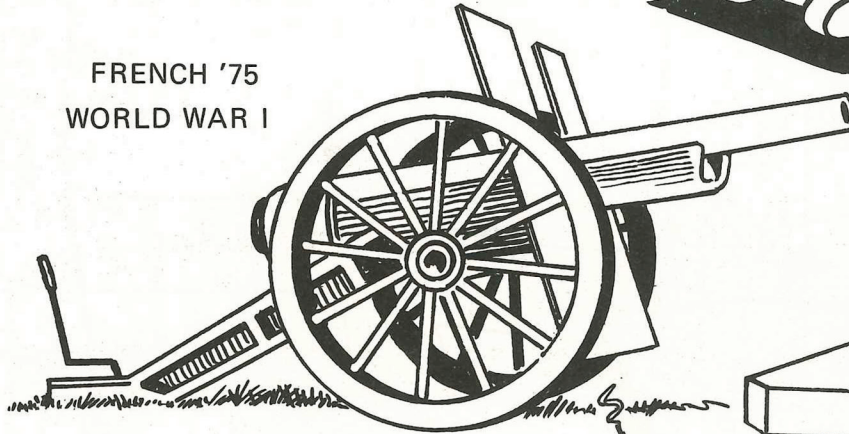
Saint Barbara's Room

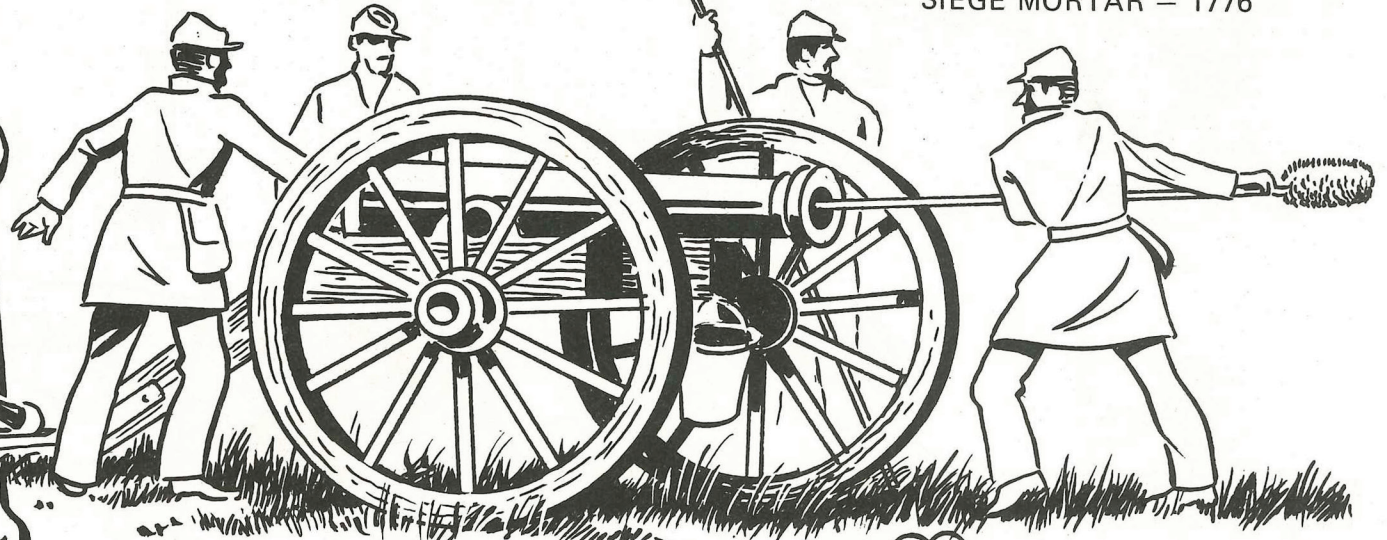

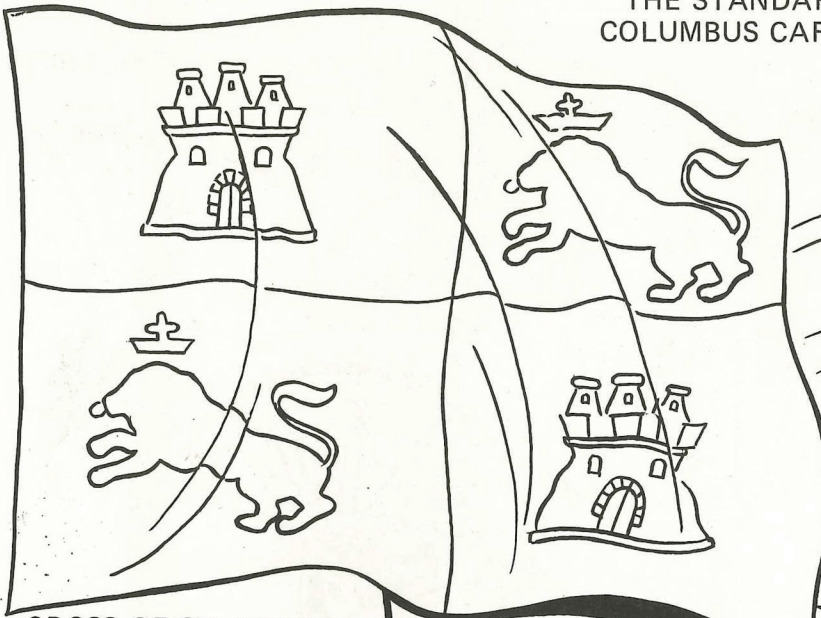

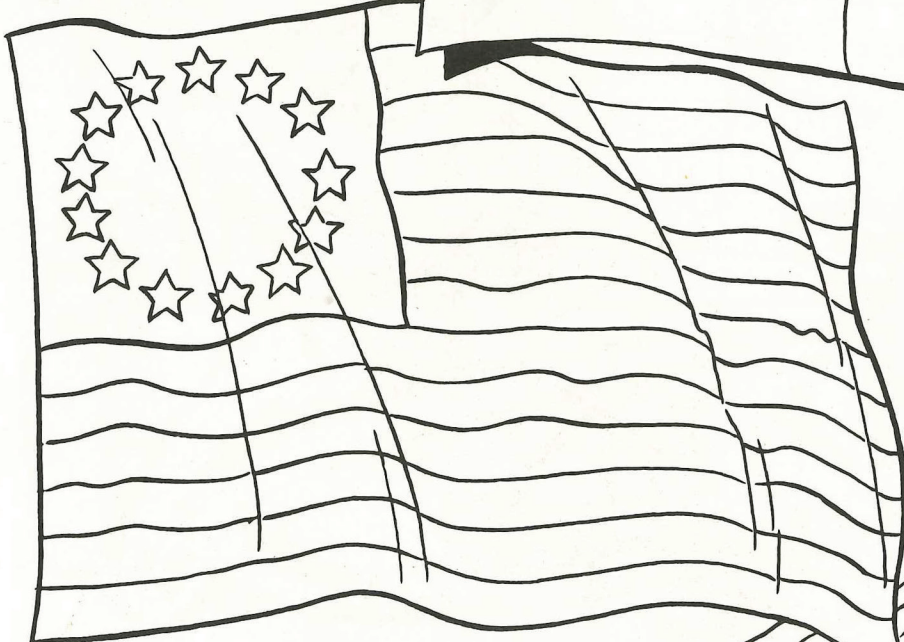
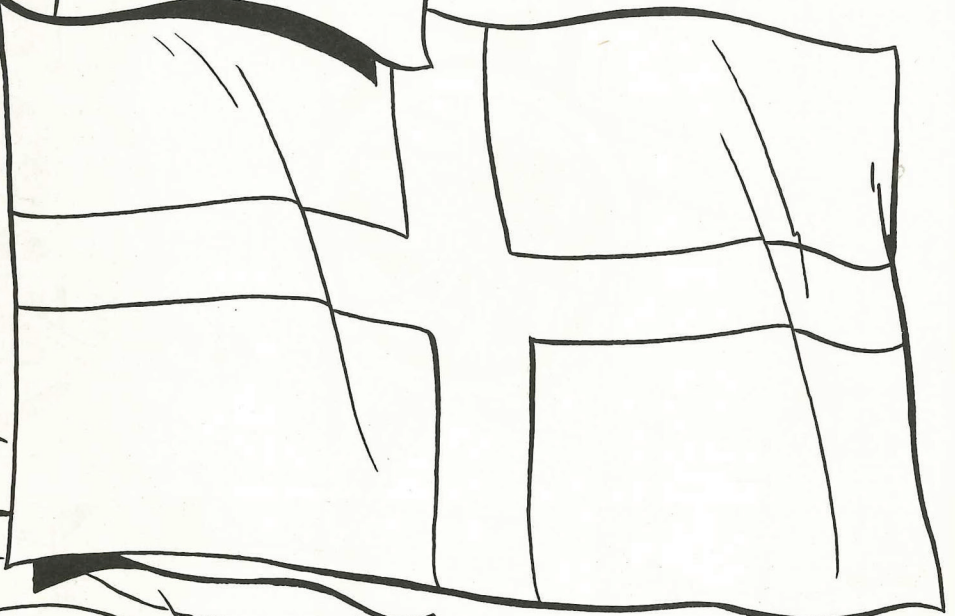

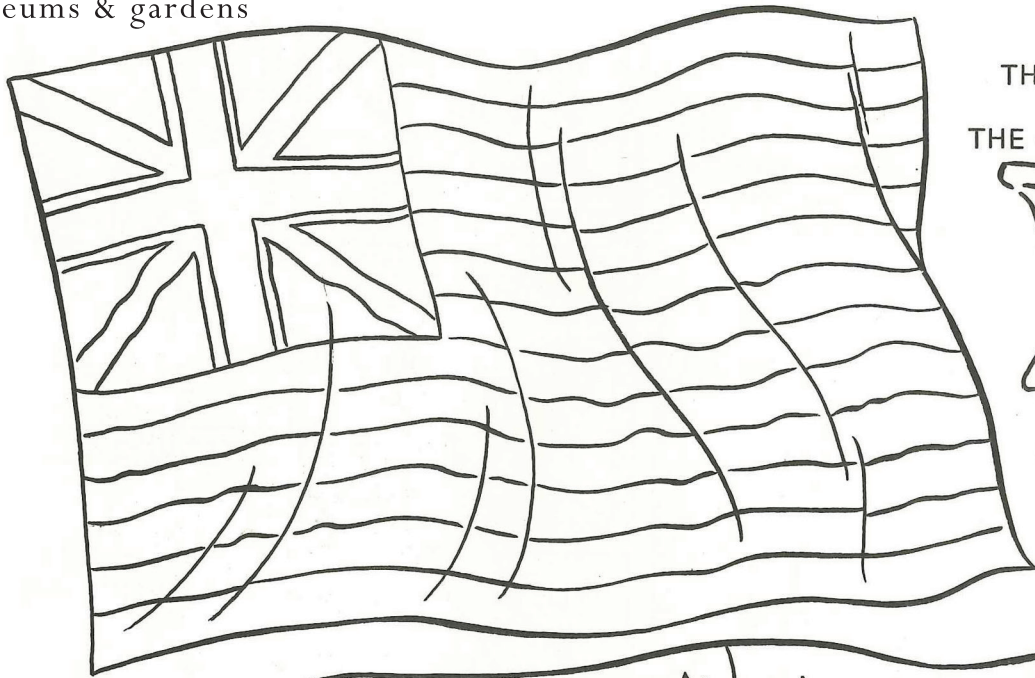

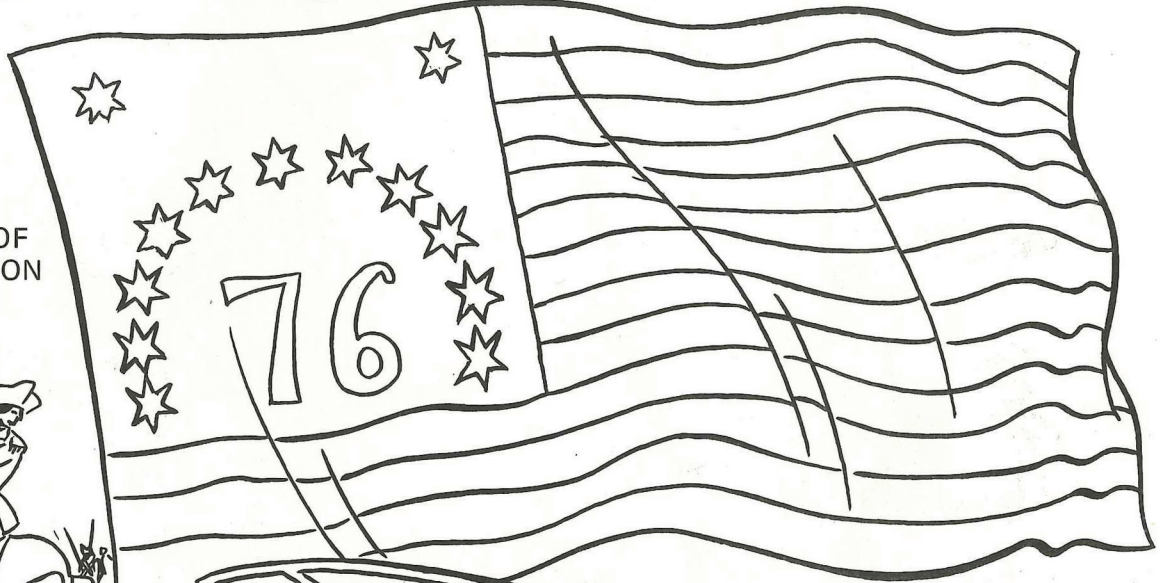

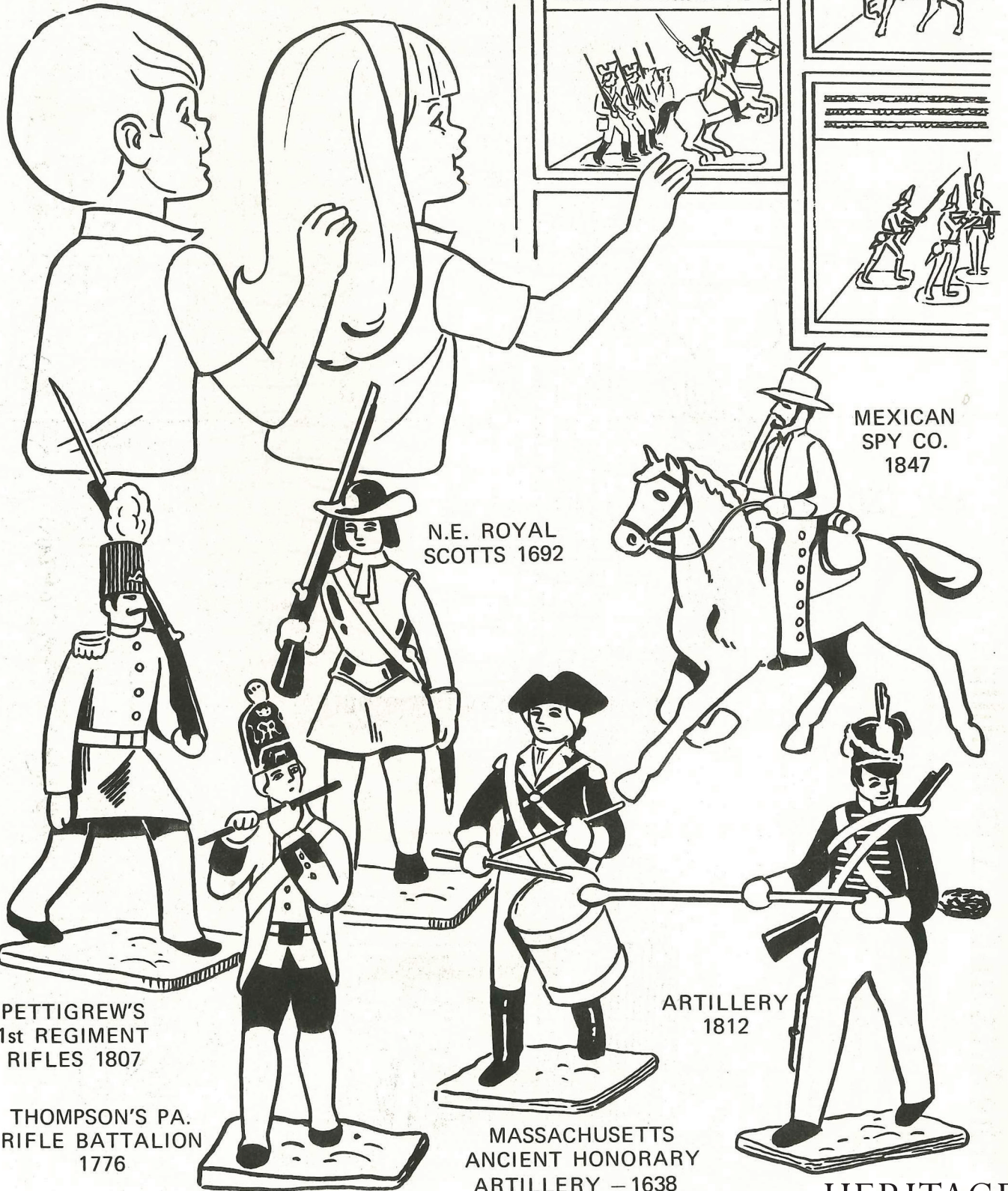

"Molly Pitcher"

Molly Pitcher's real name was Mary Hays, a camp follower from Carlisle, Pennsylvania. Legend has it that when her husband was felled by an enemy bullet, she bravely took over his position at the cannon. She got the name "Molly Pitcher" from her practice of carrying pitchers of cool water to the thirsty American artillerymen.





The Dioramas
